*Where a Percentage Bequest is intended*

When completed, keep this Codicil in a **safe place along with the original copy of your Will** and tell your executor where you have put it.

**Do not staple or pin** this Codicil to your current original Will. It will void that Will.

And remember, **do not ask** a beneficiary to witness your signature – it will disqualify them from receiving a gift in your Will. Your witnesses must be 18 year or over.
